SOLOS Meeting Minutes 02/10/2022

Introduction of new members.

Shoney's breakfast outing on 1/27 had 5 attendees and the recommendation was not to return.

Buddy Meeks asked if folks were interested in another breakfast outing and asked for recommendations. Cracker Barrel was suggested; 9:30 was the time determined, and Mon or Thurs were the best days for most at the meeting. Buddy will announce a date.

Dues is on hold until membership settles and decisions are made on a members-only web site.

Buddy asked about opening the club up outside of Lake Tansi. There were some folks who were concerned about doing that. It was suggested that the club be opened to other members via referrals from current members. A final decision was not made, but most seemed to favor the suggestion.

Web site is also on hold; although Pat Bolz volunteered to put together a web site as well as keep a database of members.

Jan Murray talked about the Cumberland Playhouse. The next show is a children's show, by children, on 2/17; Sylvia, a comedy, starts on 3/18 thru 5/1, but is in the small theater, which has stairs. Consensus seemed to be to avoid the small theater if possible. The Playhouse has senior discounts and group discounts, but the group discount is only a couple of dollars less than the senior discount. Group discounts need ≥ 10 people; requires 20% down with the remainder due 7-10 days prior to the show date; a group of 10-14 people gets a free ticket, typically for the organizer. Murder on the Orient Express is playing 4/15 - 5/31, cost \$30. Shows generally cost \$28, \$30, & \$32, there are matinees in addition to the evening performances.
